The two days Professional Development Workshop on Empowerment of Differently Abled began with a warm welcome address given by the Director in charge of CeDS, Dr. Beela. G.K. The presidential address was delivered by Dr. Mujeeb. A, Director, LBS Center for Science and Technology. Shri.L.Radhakrishnan IAS, Adviser to Chief Minister, delivered the inaugural address. The speakers emphasized on the task before the society mainly to empower the disabled and to develop a knowledge system so that further studies will gel with passion and compassion through effective problem solving systematic methods, which in future will easily help to benefit the disabled to join the mainstream.

The technical sessions were handled by experts in diverse fields of disability management. Dr. T.P. Ashraf, the Executive Director of Kerala State Social Security Mission delivered an informative lecture on "Educational Rights of Children with Disabilities". ## WORKSHOP ON CHILD DEVELOPMENT THROUGH HORTICULTURE THERAPY

Technical

Horticulture Therapy activities

Centre for Disability Studies has started the Horticulture Therapy (HT) project at 10 selected schools in and around Thiruvananthapuram district. The workshop on "Child Development through Horticulture Therapy" aimed at imparting horticulture therapy training to stakeholders of 10 selected schools. Participants included the head of selected schools, teachers in charge of the HT project, resource teachers and PTA president or representative. hence 4 persons each from 10 schools attended the workshop. On 27th April , . the programme was conducted at CeDS and the following three days of the workshop was held at Kerala Agricultural University, Vellayani..

#### The Inaugural session - Day - 1 (27.04.15)

The beginning of the session was marked with an inspiring welcome speech by Dr. Beela. G.K., Director in charge of CeDS. Dr. Mujeeb. A, Director of LBS Center for Science and Technology, gave the Presidential address. Shri.L.Rajan, Additional DPI who was the chief guest of the day honored the function by delivering the keynote address. Smt. Harifal Beegum, DDE, Thiruvananthapuram district and Dr.Prakash, Professor and Head of the Dept of Extension, Kerala Agricultural University gave the felicitation. Smt. Latha.V.A., Junior Superintendent of CeDS concluded the session by delivering a thanks giving speech.

#### Session 1

Following the inaugural session, there were three technical sessions. Session I, a motivational session, was conducted by Dr. Prakash, Prof and Head, Dept of Extension, Kerala Agricultural University. The session aimed at motivating the participants for conducting the HT project activities in schools.

### Session 2

Session 2, Introduction to Horticulture Therapy was dealt with by Dr. Beela.G.K.The origin of Horticulture Therapy, the world scenario, the Indian scenario and the Kerala scenario were discussed in her talk. She discussed in detail about the therapy methods given to the differently abled children through horticulture activities. Different types of garden, tools and the results of previous studies on HT done in Kerala were also dealt with in detail.

## Session 3

Session 3 was carried out by Mr. Sanjeev who talked in detail about the landscape design in HT garden and mentioned about the gardening methods in 10 selected schools. The session was followed by another session on HT activities which were dealt with by Dr.Princly Pappachan, and Mrs. Raji, Project Fellows at CeDS. The participants were grouped into 5 groups and they were asked to prepare different materials required to make a garden with the help of clay dough. Model of HT garden prepared by CeDS with clay dough, flowers, sand etc. was shown to them as a model. After that they made their own garden with these materials. The session ended with a relaxation exercise given by Dr. Beela.G.K.



#### Day 2 (28.04.2015)

Venue: Kerala Agricultural University, Vellayani Session I was on "Seed cultivation and Nursery Management" by Dr.Abdul Vahab, Prof of Horticulture (Retd). Dr. B. Reghunath, Prof. KAU delivered a splendid lecture on "Horticulture Theory and its Concepts". The lecture was followed by a vivid talk on flower arrangement, by Dr. Rari John, Associate Professor; Kerala Agricultural University who made the session more appealing by the demonstration of different methods of flower arrangement.



#### Day3 (29.04.2015)

The day started with a lecture by Dr. Geetha.D on Mushroom Cultivation. The class was followed by a practical session at the department where participants were given hands on training on the methods of mushroom cultivation. Afternoon session of day two was handled by Dr. B. Reghunath on Selection, Maintenance and Protection of crops in Horticulture Therapy.

#### Day 4 (02.05.2015)

Dr. V.B. Padmanabhan, an expert in terrace farming gave enlightening lectures on organic pesticides and fertilizers and discussed about the varied methods of terrace farming and the preparation of organic pesticides. He urged the participants to cultivate crops for essential consumption at their own homes. The workshop ended with a valedictory session which was presided by the Dean of Kerala Agricultural University, Dr. Swaroop John.

## A Promising Career in Animation for Differently Abled Children

Differently abled children have a right to suitable, effective and appropriate education. A large proportion of challenged children have 'special educational needs'. Good hand skills and a strong visual imagination are far more important than any computing experience. Animation course is the ideal one for differently abled children having a background knowledge of Graphic Design, Fine Arts, Illustration and Media.

Moreover, this course will help the differently abled students to develop their skills in in art, design and literature works. Their creative ideas can be made use of in various employment oppurtunities. These students can be accommodated in various industries dealing with animation software, 2D and 3D animation, 3D games, character design, compositing, special effects and editing.

The overall aim of the program is to enable such children to face their life courageously and work on individual and group projects to develop a level of self confidence, thus mainstreaming them into the society.

Animation skill helps the hearing impaired students to express their emotions through their creative work and often they love to see others admiring them for something they have created. Once they have completed this course, they can enter into their own professional careers. They can also participate in competitions.

Unless and until the differently abled persons are provided with skill based education, they may not get the appropriate rehabilitation services which would inturn prevent them from becoming financially independent.

Focusing upon these problems, Centre for Disability Studies (CeDS), is conducting an Animation course that gives more importance to the topics like character design work that demonstrates successful integration of principles of animation, technology & personal aesthetic sense. s

# ATTENTION DEFICIT HYPERACTIVITY DISORDER.

The above signs may be observed in children frequently and usually do not mean the child has ADHD. It is when these signs become significantly more pronounced in one child, compared to other children of the same age, and when his/her behaviour undermines his/her school and social life, that the child may have ADHD.s

## Management of ADHD

behavioural intervention training to improve attention span diet counselling physical exercise motivating rather than demotivating relaxation ADHD (Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder) is the most common behavioural disorder that starts during childhood. ADHD in children is completely different from normal childhood excited and boisterous behavior. Many children, especially very young ones, are inattentive and restless without necessarily being affected by ADHD. Health care professionals may use any of the following terms when describing a child (or an older person) who is overactive and has difficulty concentrating - attention deficit, attention deficit hyperactivity disorder, hyperkinetic disorder, hyperactivity.

## General signs of ADHD in children

the child is restless, overactive, fidgety
the child is constantly chattering
the child is continuously interrupting people
the child cannot concentrate for long on specific tasks
the child is inattentive
the child finds it hard to wait his/her turn in play,
conversations or standing in line (queue)
